## HENRY DEARBORN

1751 - 1829 FROM CAPTAIN TO CABINET SECRETARY

July 7, 1779 "I ate part of a fried rattlesnake today, which would have tasted very well, had it not been snake."

From Bunker Hill to Yorktown, Dearborn would serve eight years and a month, often at 'the sharp end' of things, as well as on Washington's staff. Post-war he served two terms in Congress, later as a cabinet secretary, and was, before retiring in 1824, President Monroe's Minister to Portugal. But in 1818 he found himself the center of a controversy that would extend to 1843.
