SUBJECT: Land Use Planning/Zoning Open House



The Groton Citizen Planning Committee (CPC) was recently formed by the Planning Board.

"The CPC's mission is to assist the Planning Board through discussions with residents and property owners to determine what they would like to see enacted to maintain and protect the town's environment and character for the future, and to provide recommendations and proposals to the Planning Board for changes to the existing planning and zoning regulations that will fulfill Groton's Vision Statement and Principles of the Master Plan adopted on December 27, 2017."

Groton's year-round population has grown from 120 in 1970 to approximately 600 in 2016. Because we are a small rural community, it is important that we consider the kinds of changes that could take place in our town that will affect its character and harm our lifestyles and property values. While we are able, we should consider steps that can be taken now to prevent unwanted changes.

The committee is scheduling two open-house events on February 16 and 17 to provide you with information on the reason for a Master Plan, and zoning and land use regulations. You will have the opportunity to visit a series of information stations, participate in group discussion, and provide your comments.
